"Real property, the expansion, redevelopment, or reuse of which may be complicated by the presence <u>or potential</u> <u>presence</u> of a hazardous substance, pollutant, or contaminant." EPA

18th Century – Industrial Revolution: agrarian and rural, to industrial and urban society; created machines, new chemical manufacturing, iron production, factory systems



industrial chemicals and wastes: sulfuric acid, soda ash, limes, dyes, wood pulp, animal byproducts




buried, dumped, discharged to waterways





19th **Century:** Urban populations grew; neighborhoods formed around industry



Wastes: wood preservatives, paints, solvents, coal tar, petroleum products

Continued to bury, dump, and discharge to waterways





20th Century:

- More chemical plants, petroleum refineries, and munitions industries
- Synthetic materials: plastics, and pesticides



More waste, more contamination







Mid-1900's:

- · Urban exodus; economic shift
- industries, factories, warehouses, rail yards, and mills that were once part of our nation's economic and historic fabric – obsolete, moved
- Abandoned industrial sites; soil and water contamination









1960s: the beginning of a national awakening to the environmental ills perpetrated by industrial America

- Contributes to negative perception of the neighborhood






