Hudson County Overview

- 12 municipalities
- Population 634,266 (2010)
 - o 674,836 (2015 6.4% increase)
- 14,617.1 persons/sq. mile
 - Sixth most densely populated county in the country
- Varied geographic relief
 - Floodplain / Meadowlands
 - Palisades Sill
- Coastal / Tidal Influence
 - Hudson River
 - Hackensack River
 - Passaic River
 - Kill Van Kull / Newark Bay
 - New York Harbor






Hudson County Overview

Illustrating Risk

- 130 miles of shoreline
- Coastal / Not Riverine
- 51.5 sq/miles Special Flood Hazard Area (SFHA)
 - 50% of the county's land area






Hudson County Overview

Who/What is at Risk?

- o People!
 - ~100k in the SFHA(15% of total population)
 - Vulnerable populations
- Property
 - ~7,500 structures in the SFHA
 (9.3% of all structures)
 - \$12,852,485,459(Total Improvement Value)
 - \$6,397,963,698 in potential losses from a 1% Annual
 Chance Flood

Who/What is at Risk?

- Critical Facilities in the SFHA
 - 341 at-risk facilities
 - 52 first response
 - o 29 schools
 - 49 transportation
 - 41 electric utilities
 - 4 medical facilities
 - 21 rail facilities
 - 83 hazmat locations

What was the goal?


- Assess each participating community's ability to implement the Community

The CRS Plan

What were the results?

- No Hudson County communities are ready to apply
 - o 7 "Yellow"
 - o 3 "Red"
- Programmatic deficiencies
- Issues identified easy to rectify (by government standards)
 - Biggest Issues
 - Programmatic Regulations and Administration
 - Non-compliant structures






The County's Role

O DO NOT IMPOSE!






The County's Role

 - Hudson County (soon!)










The County's Role
