
Newark is a place to live

- More people will spur retail openings and create a 24/7 atmosphere
- New buildings coming online
 - Teachers Village 206 units
 - Hahne's 160 units
 - One Theater Square 245 Units
 - Verizon Building 267 Units
 - One Riverview 169 units
 - Bears Stadium 1400 units
 - Kislak 48 units

Newark is a place to work

- Old style of stand alone buildings connected via skyways is over. Skyways are BANNED in Downtown's redevelopment plan.
- New office buildings come online with ground floor retail.
 - Prudential garage wrapped in retail
 - Ironside will have retail opening on a 3 acre park
- Office employees active public spaces during the day when residents are away at work.



Newark is a place to play

- Public space is critical Downtown is its own neighborhood but it's also a place where every city resident should feel welcome.
- Riverfront Park
 - Reclaiming the river after a century of neglect.
 15 acre park with amenities including dog runs, volley ball, rock climbing, boat house, beach and more.
- Mulberry Commons
 - 3 acre park born out of a public/private partnership. Connections to Penn station platforms will help connect Ironbound and Downtown
- Private spaces
 - Hahne's Grand Arcade is a destination that connects to the city and acts as a covered street.
